Surprised by Joy

When I first came into the rooms of recovery a little over 25 years ago, someone in one of those first meetings told me "If you stay sober, things will happen to you



beyond your wildest dreams." I thought. Yea, right (code sarcasm). Things up to then had certainly been in my worse nightmares, but dreams. Never. gonna. happen.

Well it did. Over and over and over. The first miracle was that I actually stayed sober that first year. And I didn't have to go to the hospital any more! No kidding. I had been visiting mental wards for over a decade multiple times a year. And when I quit drinking, got a sponsor, started going to meetings on a regular basis, doing what "they" told me to... I quit having the breakdowns that had ruined my life and career up to then. You're kidding... and all those years I had no idea that my drinking was even an issue!

Yes I got my career back, got my family back, got my self esteem back, all those "get backs" that I never thought could happen.

In the meantime, I learned how to live. It's amazing how much life can be lived when I'm not filling my days with trying to "act" sane, all the while, just enduring life until the next suicide attempt and hospitalization. I started sponsoring and through the miracle of CIR began sponsoring a young woman in Canada! I had never been out of the deep South my entire life. In 2006 I traveled to visit her in the Pacific Northwest. and we toured the Canadian Rockies. I thought to myself the first time I saw the Pacific Ocean they were right! Then when I saw the glaciers and the mountains I thought, "They WERE right!"

This past fall I retired from a career as a research scientist. Just before I was asked to speak at an International Medical Conference in Taiwan! What Yes, they paid for me to fly over and spend about a week in exchange for a scientific presentation that went surprisingly well. Taiwan? That's over in the Far East?



Right? Have to fly almost 24 hours? Yup. That one. I couldn't deny it anymore. Things were certainly happening beyond my WILDEST DREAMS. The picture on the front cover of this issue of the Gabriel is my testimony to that. I was having breakfast on the balcony of a hotel at a beautiful place called Sun Moon Lake in the southern part of the island. Folks, God is GOOD. All the time. He has proven that to me and I hope to you also! Let's wonder what else our HP has in his gift box for us! Blessings,

The Truth Shall Set You Free

Part 1 of a 10 part series

I would like to think out loud with the rest of you for a while. One of my favorite verses in Scripture is John 8:32: You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. It seems, at first, to be a "no-brainer" in terms of interpretation:

- (1) It is Jesus talking;
- (2) He is the truth; and
- (3) we can find freedom in life through Him.

The application to anyone in recovery is also obvious: in recovery we want to be free of our addictions, but we know we need to find a deeper freedom in order to achieve that. It is one thing to stop drinking, drugging, etc., but it is another thing to remain free and also have a life centered in God. The Steps are the tried and true way of helping any of us to find the freedom to be the person God wants us to be. For us as Christians, Scripture is a big part of those Steps. To me, Scripture is just about the one tried and true source of revelation from God. I can state categorically that Scripture is why I have remained sober for 12 years:

the study, absorption and application of God's truths for me.

You can find John 8:32 in a lot of secular situations. I have seen it on the front entrance to the Library where I did my Ph.D. work. I have seen it on certain places as a memorable quote. After all, truth and freedom are very universal attributes sought by all since the beginning of time. And, Christians view truth very different from other groups or faiths.

What I was not overly aware of was John 8:31. I want to quote it and include John 8:32.

So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of mine, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

The key word is "if." Although I am a student of Scripture, I don't pretend to know it all. I just cannot recall very many conditional statements in the New Testament. That "If then" phrase is very common in the Old Testament. We tend to generalize that the Old Testament is "conditional" while the New Testament is "unconditional." While I am sure these broad generalizations are true, I pause when I see the conditional statement in John



8:31-32. There is a lot to consider in the words "continue" - "disciple" "know" "truth" "free", etc.

I want to pursue this and I would like you, the reader, to come with me. This study is based on a set of sermons I heard from Dr. Charles Stanley back in the 80's. Then, about ten years later I went through a crisis and used this study to help me get through it. I listened to the sermons again. I put together a 13 page outline-based study for my own use and it is in my files now as an article called "Truth for Me" And now, about ten years after that, I am going to do this study again since I am once again going through a crisis. I suspect I will eventually get into all of that personal stuff, but for now I suspect I had better just leave that out.

As Christians we know we have freedom. That freedom comes from the grace of God through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. That is a given and a factual assurance. We are truly free. But, very often we just don't live that way, and one of the reasons we don't live that way is that we get wrapped up in our stuff and forget about our Christian walk. That has happened to me a lot of times. You

are familiar with one of the important themes of Rick Warren's Purpose Driven Life: "It's not about me." Well, too often I have thought it was about me and this has caused me problems that have really burdened me over the years. Jesus has been with me on all of this, thankfully, but dear reader know this: you can find forgiveness for your actions and sins, but you still live with consequences. David was forgiven by God but there were many unfortunate events that proceeded after his adultery with Bathsheba, and the murder of her husband Uriah.

And so, my purpose here is to go back to the basics and realize that freedom in God one more time. I hope you will come along with me.

Poem Title: *Leaning On Psalm 46*



Allow the Lord to speak to you through His Word in this inspirational message from RonRoss.

The longing to belong is very powerful and foundational to our sense of self. But there is an infinitely greater pull — Father's. He is constantly seeking us out and calling our heart to his!

"My son, give me your heart." Proverbs 23:26

When we respond to this call it becomes a homecoming. The prodigal came to himself while slopping hogs and experienced a homecoming that he never imagined possible. How about you? Do you know beyond a shadow of doubt that you belong? Don't allow anyone to tell you something else.

Make sure no outsider who now follows God ever has occasion to say, "God put me in second-class. I don't really belong." Isaiah 56:2 Msg

- Now you are no longer strangers to God and foreigners to heaven, but you are members of God's very own family, citizens of God's country and you belong in God's household with every other Christian. Ephesians 2:19

Each of Us is that 100th Sheep

... sheep are... stubborn, stupid and always getting lost and into trouble. Sheep also don't have any natural defenses and are helpless. And we are sheep. Great.

"My people hath been lost sheep: their shepherds have caused them to go astray, they have turned them away on the mountains: they have gone from mountain to hill, they have forgotten their resting-place." Jeremiah 50:6

Most of us are familiar with the parable of the lost sheep and the passage about the good shepherd.

Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninetynine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninetynine righteous persons who

do not need to repent." Luke 15:3-7

"I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep." John 10:11

And most of us have seen the matching artwork, the depiction of a loving, attentive Jesus holding a lamb in His arms. He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart... Isaiah 40:11

Yet, there seems to be a disconnection. Yeah, yeah, yeah. Jesus loves us; He's our good shepherd. But do we REALLY personalize it? And what exactly would that mean to us?



Years ago, Bishop T.D.
Jakes did a message on sheep. Scripture often refers to people as that creature. And it's honestly not a flattering comparison. As Bishop Jakes went on to point out how sheep are... stubborn, stupid and always getting lost and into trouble. Sheep also don't have any natural defenses and are helpless.

And we are sheep. Great.

When I was a kid in Vacation Bible School, one of the teachers tried to do a visualization technique. (I say tried because, after all, we're talking about kids here- lambs- baby sheep. So we're talking stubborn, stupid and prone to getting lost, all with unbound

youthful energy. But I digress).

Anyway, she suggested each one of us see ourselves as that lamb, that 100th sheep, once lost, now safely tucked in our shepherd's arms. And then, from there, really get the feeling of just how much God loves us.

I know - again, kids here. Besides, it seems too simplistic.

But, years later, as fully grown adults, we're still struggling with that very same notion. We still look like ridiculous lost sheep, in desperate need of a patient and capable shepherd to swoop in and save our hides.

For this is what the Sovereign LORD says: "I myself will search for my sheep and look after them. As a shepherd seeketh out his flock in the day that he is among his sheep that are scattered; so will I seek out my sheep, and will deliver them out of all places where they have been scattered in the cloudy and dark day. And I will bring them out from the people, and gather them from the countries, and will bring them to their own land, and feed them upon the mountains of Israel by the rivers, and in all the inhabited places of the country.

I will feed them in a good pasture, and upon the high mountains of Israel shall their fold be: there shall they lie in a good fold, and in a fat pasture shall they feed upon the mountains of Israel. I will feed my flock, and I will cause them to lie down, saith the Lord GOD. I will seek that which was lost, and bring again that which was driven away, and will bind up that which was broken, and will strengthen that which was sick..."

Ezekiel 34:11-16

No matter how old we get, how much money we make, what we accomplish or how together we appear, we never outgrow our sheep status. And that might be completely depressing if it weren't for one large detail we, too often forgotten, if we know it at all: God loves us. And it's not a casual kind of love either.

"Since you were precious in my sight... I have loved you..." Isaiah 43:4

The LORD hath appeared of old unto me, saying, "Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee." Jeremiah 31:3

Love is why He puts up with us and our sheepish ways. We just don't get it.

Nevertheless, God cannot help Himself but to love us. And each one of us is that lost 100th sheep special to God; we're that important. Our feelings and experiences backing that up matter

not; it goes beyond us and our finite perspectives. God's thoroughly convinced of His love for us. And He doesn't change His mind.

Again...

For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39

We're sheep. We cannot change that truth. But we can go a lot further if we choose not to argue with God in His love and reasons for pursuing, chasing and loving us.

I often think of and tell other Fellow addicts in recovery who have decided to have another go at it—since they have been in recovery for several yrs and have become complacent thinking they can handle a few drinks of alcohol— that there is an empty picture frame hanging in the recovery rooms. It is waiting for the picture of an alcoholic/addict who went back out and became a social drinker/user. :-)

Sadly, one of my drinking buddies who entered recovery the month after I did decided after several yrs in recovery that he could "go with the boys" after work and have a few beers at the tavern. Since then he has had three heart attacks and his life has spiraled downward. I have lost contact with him over the yrs. The last conversation we had yrs ago was when I looked at him and said, "There is an empty picture frame hanging in the rooms of AA waiting for your picture." He knew what that meant but failed to heed the warning.


No addict/alcoholic started out with the intent of becoming a compulsive and out of control addict. But for some of us, me, that first drink lit a fire that burned and grew for many yrs. And like a forest fire, it destroyed my life and hurt the people around me. The only way I found to extinguish the out of control compulsion/fire was when I entered 12 Step Recovery and found God. As Bill W. put it; "No human being could have removed my craving."

Today's ODB Ministry reading/devotional hits the nail on the head in regards to getting too close to temptation/sin and stumbling.

ON THE EDGE

There's an underground lava tube south of Kuna, Idaho, that has gained a certain amount of local notoriety. The only entrance, as far as I know, is a yawning shaft that plunges straight down into darkness.

Some years ago I stood at the edge of that shaft and looked down. I was drawn to venture closer and almost lost my balance. I felt a moment of



Sin is like that: Curiosity can draw us toward the darkness. How often have men and women gotten too close to the edge, lost their balance, and fallen into the darkness? They've destroyed their families, reputations, and careers through adulterous affairs that began with a "mere" flirtation but then progressed to thoughts and actions. Looking back they almost always say, "I never thought it would come to this."

We think we can flirt with temptation, get very close to the edge, and walk away, but that's a fool's dream. We know an action is wrong and yet we toy with it. Then, inescapably, we are drawn into deeper and darker perversions. Jesus put it simply: "Whoever commits sin is a slave of sin" (John 8:34).

And so, seeing our own need for God's help, we pray as David did in Psalm 19:13, "Keep back Your servant also from [deliberate] sins; let them not have dominion over me."

Heavenly Father, whether we are being tempted now, or have fallen, we thank You that You are always there, and You love us with relentless love. We have nowhere to turn but to You.

A big fall begins with a little stumble.

INSIGHT:

Having proven that all people are sinners and having shown how sinners are justified through faith in Jesus (Rom. 1–4), Paul now describes the new life we can have because of what Jesus did (ch. 5–8). We can live differently, we can choose not to sin, and we can live holy lives (6:1-14). In today's passage, Paul warns that we become the slave of whatever we choose to obey (vv. 16-20). Rather than give ourselves to sin, we are to give ourselves to God (vv. 22-23). When we do sin, we bear the consequences of our sins and experience a lack of fellowship with God (Gal. 6:7-8). 
