## The Truth Shall Set You Free

Part 2 of a 10 part series

We all want to be free. The desire to be free is part of our make-up, and that means God gave us that desire. In my case, I want to be free to be the man God wants me to be. I have always wanted that. Wanting and achieving are two different things, however.

I have fears. These fears weigh me down. What caused them? I have ideas, theories, and sometimes even valid reasons why these fears exist. But, what matters is how I handled these fears. Some people grow out of them. I didn't. I took them with me into adulthood. By doing that, I thought I could use them to my advantage. The best thing to do was to plan, anticipate, scheme, and prepare. The overall plan for the day was to control, control, control. That took a lot of thought. In the process I became an insomniac.

And, over time, I became an alcoholic.

Why? Because as life happened, it got more complex and there were too many loose ends. The pain of seeing these dangling ends was too much. Alcohol took care of that and, in an odd way, it helped. I could sit up at night and plan, anticipate, scheme, and prepare and be energized by the alcohol.

Eventually all of this came to a head: my world imploded, and my biology crashed. Suddenly there I was totally alone; a person that I hated.

Trouble was, I really was that person.

So, what was I to do? In fact, I did not do anything. It was Jesus who did something. He confronted me. He got into my face. He tried a variety of ways to intervene which I, of course, either could not see or perhaps was too self-absorbed to see.

When you hit bottom, you are so alone. All of you who read this know that. I had failed myself and others, and others had failed me. I was desperately alone. I was so alone I was physically ill.

There I sat, ill and slowly dying, surrounded by happy tourists on a gloriously sunny Saturday, October 21, 1994, in beautiful Colonial Williamsburg. That was when He spoke. There was no audible sound. He spoke in my spirit: "Michael, the reason you are in bad health is because of your drinking. Once you stop the drinking, your health will improve and everything will be all right."

Jesus was using the word "health" in two ways. The first applied to the disease of alcoholism. The second applied to the deeper spiritual disease or malaise which I knew would force me to address



long hidden issues out of my entire life. Frankly, it was the second disease that I feared the most.

So, where did I need to start?

I started through His Word. Scripture. Later that day, as I was sinking into withdrawal (I had not had any alcohol in 12 hours)I asked Him how -- how was I ever going to stop drinking? And, on top of that, what was I to do with myself once I stopped? Horrible fear overtook me -- the fear that I would be so exposed and helpless for all to see with no place to hide, being a person even I did not like. It was terrible. I saw no way out.

He gave me two verses: Proverbs 3:5 and Philippians 4:13. I took out the Gideon bible in our motel room and found them:

*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding.* Proverbs 3:5

I can do all things through Him who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13

Suddenly the fear was gone. The "edge" of alcoholic withdrawal was taken away, and I felt human—real. And I even felt safe in the knowledge that I was there, in Him, and

comfortable being who I really was. I claim this as a divine intervention in my life, and in many respects, the next day, October 22nd, was really the first day of the rest of my life: a life that had to be grounded in God, not in my fears and need for control.

So, it was His Word that was put me on the road to freedom. I am not there yet. I was not instantly healed. I will be seeking good health in both of these areas for the rest of my life. Probably I will never quite get to the end of the road, but by then I will be in His arms and then it will be glorious.

Until then, I have His Word, and I want to continue in His Word in order to know truth and through that truth, have freedom.

In the next installment, I want to give some thought to the word "continue" as Jesus used that word.

My name is Michael the Penguin and I am a Christian in recovery.

## 10 QUESTIONS TO ASK AT A CHRISTMAS GATHERING

Many of us struggle to make conversation at Christmas gatherings, whether church events, work-related parties, neighborhood drop-ins, or annual family occasions. Sometimes our difficulty lies in having to chat with people we rarely see or have never met.

At other times we simply don't know what to say to those with whom we feel little in common. Moreover, as Christians we want to take advantage of the special opportunities provided by the Christmas season to share our faith, but are often unsure how to begin.

Here's a list of questions designed not only to kindle a conversation in almost any Christmas



situation, but also to take the dialog gradually to a deeper level. Use them in a private conversation or as a group exercise, with believers or unbelievers, with strangers or with family.

- 1. What's the best thing that's happened to you since last Christmas?
- 2. When was your best Christmas ever? Why?
- 3. What's the most meaningful Christmas gift you've ever received?
- 4. What was the most appreciated Christmas gift you've ever given?
- 5. What was your favorite Christmas tradition as a child?
- 6. What is your favorite Christmas tradition now?
- 7. What do you do to try to keep Christ in Christmas?
- 8. Why do you think people started celebrating the birth of Jesus?
- 9. Do you think the birth of Jesus deserves such a worldwide celebration?
- 10. Why do you think Jesus came to earth?

Of course, remember to pray before your Christmas gatherings. Ask the Lord to grant you "divine appointments," to guide your conversations, and to open doors for the gospel. May He use you to bring glory to Christ this Christmas.

## HOLIDAY TRADITIONS & EATING DISORDER RITUALS

"Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye." Mark 7:13

The holiday season is all about traditions. Families make their own - everything from the food, to decorations, and outings.

Traditions can be wonderful. However, seen through the prism of eating disorder rituals, they can be imprisoning.

"Rituals are both a tactic not to eat and also a kind of obsession associated with anorexia. When eating disorders are starting, people will try to make it look like they are eating by cutting things up and shifting food around on the plate so as to not draw attention to how little they are eating." Cynthia Bulik, PhD, eating disorder specialist at the University of North Carolina- Chapel Hill

Traditions and Rituals all come with the same expectations: Perfection, Happiness and a Sense of Safety.

Rituals are repetitive actions and behaviors such as counting the number of times one chews his/her food before swallowing, meticulously counting calories, or using the same bowl and spoon to eat. There's an exacting precision attached to keeping these behaviors - and a dreadful fear if one is unable to do so.

It certainly doesn't make the holiday season very joyful. And God has desired abundance for us:

"...I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10

Furthermore, God has given us freedom to choose:

"All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not." 1 Corinthians 10:23

"All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." 1 Corinthians 6:12



For someone struggling with disordered eating however, that's easier read than lived.

Yet, if we face our own truth about why we do what we do, fully aware of perfection's demanding and impossible nature, we can ease up on ourselves and be fully present with the holidays as they occur.

It may be helpful to realize that the "picturebook" holiday is not a reality for many people. Some cannot afford it. There are many single people who are not close to their families or do not have a family, and there are many families that do not fit into the dominant cultural model of "family". Do not blame yourself for family or friendship conflicts. People are no different during the holidays than they are at other times of the year. 
## Hey! Did you know?





I have not had a drink since.

My schoolmate visited me, and I fully acquainted him with my problems and deficiencies. We made a list of people I had hurt or toward whom I felt resentment. I expressed my entire willingness to approach these individuals, admitting my wrong. Never was I to be critical of them. I was to right all such matters to the utmost of my ability.

I was to test my thinking by the new God-consciousness within. Common sense would thus become uncommon sense. I was to sit quietly when in doubt, asking only for direction and strength to meet my problems as He would have me. Never was I to pray for myself, except as my requests bore on my usefulness to others. Then only might I expect to receive. But that would be in great measure.

My friend promised when these things were done I would enter upon a new relationship with my Creator; that I would have the elements of a way of living which answered all my problems. Belief in the power of God, plus enough willingness, honesty and humility.
