### The Truth Shall Set You Free

### Part 3 of a 10 part series



In the second installment, I testified how God's Word -- His Truth -- set me on the road to freedom, not just freedom from alcohol, but also freedom to become the man God wants me to be.

Presumably the story could have ended there. After all, I had hit rock bottom, knew despair and loneliness, hated the person I really was, and all of this ended by the intervention of my Lord Jesus. Not only did He intervene but He showed me truth in His word, and that truth set me free.

End of story. Let the violins swell up to a crescendo while you see me disappearing into a beautiful landscape of life wonderful.

No. The story begins there. That landscape is beautiful at times, but a lot of the times it is a rocky difficult terrain and it has almost sucked me dry while I navigate through it. These have been some good 12 sober years, but at the same time, they have sometimes been downright awful. Why? I did not always continue in His word. Often I would ignore His word and would go my own way, and when I did boy was it terrible. I also think that I was not discerning enough to see that in some of that rocky terrain maybe God was trying to teach me something. If so, then I flunked the class. So, these 12 years have been "up and down."



Look at these versions of <u>John</u> 8:31-32:

Then Jesus turned to the Jews who claimed to believe in Him. "If you stick with this, living out what I tell you, you are my disciples for sure. then you will experience for yourselves the truth, and the truth will free you." (The Message)

So Jesus said to those Jews who had believed in Him, if you abide in My word [hold fast to My Teachings and live in accordance with them], you are truly My disciples. And you shall know the Truth and the Truth will set you free. (The Amplified Bible).

Jesus said to them, †You are truly my disciples if you live as I tell you to and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free. (The Living Bible)

What is happening here? First, as many of you know, the gospel of John is different from the other three in that it emphasizes more of



what Jesus says as compared to what Jesus does. In Chapter Eight all we know is that He is at the Temple talking with those have followed along with Him. These public discourses dominate John's gospel up through chapter 12. From then on, His statements are to a smaller audience, mainly the Twelve and other followers.

So, the words in John 8:31-32 were for public consumption at a place revered by the Jews: the Temple. Jesus, being a good Jew, worshiped there. He also taught there. Apparently He was confronted with opposition to His teaching. But, when He spoke the words you see in John 8:28-29 many apparently came to believe in Him.

So, what does He do? He speaks directly to those people who came to believe in Him:"If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; and you shall know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

Isn't that impressive? Those who came to believe in Him got His attention and He spoke to them. I still think that is true today. In my early days as a Christian, He was there with me, teaching me through His Word, and through the lives of other Christians. This immediate attention often will separate the wheat from the chaff. In John 8:31 He lays out for them what the

character of a true disciple of His ought to be: to continue in His word.

Unfortunately, not all of those who "came to believe in Him" actually did so. Perhaps some of them had an emotional reaction that did not last. You can see that in their reactions and statements from verse 33 on. The exchange of words between these people and Jesus get pretty confrontational. Chapter Eight ends with the people trying to stone Him! But, He hides and eventually gets away and out of the Temple.

What does it mean to continue in His word? Here are some possible meanings from Webster: "to maintain without interruption a condition, course or action." To continue is to endure, stay, keep up, prolong, last, abide, and persist. One word that works is: abide. I like the way Matthew Henry put it:

"It is to dwell in Christ's word, as a man does at home, which is his center, and rest, and refuge."

I like that. As I write this, I am safe inside my home while an ice storm is raging outside. I hear the clicking of the sleet against the screens of my windows. Yet here I am in my home, my center, my refuge, safe, warm, and secure. That is what it is like to abide in His word.

Next time I want to take one more look at John 8:31.

If billowing waves of truth do surround, If pillowing rays of hopefulness hound, If You are the poor, the downcast, the meek,


Then take and refine the fortunes we seek.

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### The Power to Choose

For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. Then shall ye call upon me, and ye shall go and pray unto me, and I will hearken unto you. And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:11-13

Do you feel your life is limited by your past or that everything you do is under the scrutiny of others? Do you feel your future is not really in your hands?

That any choice you make

will certainly be wrong?

I felt this way for many years. I was externally successful, but inside I constantly felt "wrong". It was a "lose-lose" situation. If I did what I thought I was supposed to do, them by it's very nature it wasn't "me" and I was destined at some point to mess up. But if I did things that I thought

were right, even after prayer and wanting the will of God in my life I felt always on eggshells. Maybe there was more I could have or should have done. Yes I had a history of abuse but I thought I'd settled all that. I had done a 4th step AND a 5th and forgiven the perpetrator. But recently in a Bible Study on Shame realized that my insides hadn't totally healed.

Abuse is defined as the systematic pattern of behaviors in a relationship that are used to gain and/or maintain power and control over another. These relationships are often more complicated than appears on the surface. The sense of powerlessness can and does continue far beyond the actual relationship has ended. Feelings of victimization, lack of control, unwillingness to make decisions, and feelings of never doing enough are often signs of an unhealed inner victim.

The truth of God's Word brought me new light and strength. By focussing on who I am in God, not

what my past was or who I even thought I was, I realized I do not need to remain a victim. I can't change the past, but I can live both an inner and

outer life today that will

change the future.

Yes, I am still powerless over my addictions, but I am not helpless. I have a voice and that voice is prayer. My recovery and faith have shown me that my life can be meaningful. I can and do help others to find the same life and joy in helping and serving a God of my understanding. , No longer

am I a victim of my past - all that happened to me and all that I did to others. Today I have the ability to choose freedom.

It's said in the rooms, "What we focus on becomes larger. If I focus on the problem, the problem increases, but if I focus on the solution, the solution becomes stronger." I am becoming shame-free by focussing on my solution - the Lord. My perspective changes each time I share my story honestly with another alcoholic or addict. Every meeting I attend becomes a new experience that says, "You are worth it. Today is worth it."

Jesus has done for me far more than I ever did for myself. Knowing just that one thing keeps me moving forward in my recovery. God is not a tyrant. He does not weld some abusive power over me, nor is it a power struggle between God and me about what I do today. It is truly a joint effort. On days when I'm afraid to chose, to live, I can look in my heart and He is there, saying, "You're doing fine. Let's keep on going."



### What is True Spirituality?

Being "spiritual" does not mean "made up of spirit." "Spirit" is not a ghost-like substance that inhabits the truly "spiritual Christian." The adjective, as in "spiritual man" and "spiritual body," does not mean ethereal, incorporeal, immaterial, otherworldly, or even unworldly as depicted in movies like The Ghost and Mrs. Muir, Ghost, and The Sixth Sense. True spirituality takes form as we live in this world in our own bodies following God's Word in the power of the Holy Spirit.

To be Spiritual is to be guided and motivated by the Holy Spirit. It means obeying His commands as recorded in the Scriptures. The Spiritual man is not someone who floats in midair and hears eerie voices. The Spiritual man is the man who does what the Bible says (Romans 8:4–8). This means, therefore, that we are supposed to get involved in life. God wants us to apply Christian standards everywhere, in every area. Spirituality does not mean retreat and withdrawal from life.1

Spirituality is measured by "good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" (Eph. 2:10). Good works manifest themselves at the personal level as the Christian exhibits the "fruit of the Spirit" (Gal. 5:22–24), at the family level as children obey their parents (Eph. 6:1), at the business level where employers pay a promised wage (Deut. 24:15), at the judicial level where all should be considered equal before the law (Lev. 24:22), and at the civil level where civil governments are paid their due (Matt. 22:21) and do what's right (Rom. 13:4).

We have been redeemed and rescued from the pollution of the world. This does not mean that we are to turn our backs on life. Rather, we are to avoid all participation in the world's uncleanness. "Christians, indeed, as our Lord taught, are the light of the world; this they cannot be if their light is hidden or withdrawn. Thus they are to let their light shine before men (Mt. 5:14 ff.), though at the same time shunning the depravities of unregenerate society and of unchristian worship."2

A prevailing and false understanding of true spirituality is the work of the gospel turned in on itself. To be spiritual, in the modern and corrupt sense, means to internalize the effects of the Holy Spirit's regenerating work on the sinner "dead in trespasses and sins" (Ephesians 2:1). The weakness of this definition is not that spiritual "renewal starts in the private world, but that it ends there too."3 While there is an internal and spiritual reign of Christ in every



believer, there must also be an external expression of that internal faith. This is the Good Samaritan faith where Jesus tells us to "Go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). Jesus does reign in the hearts of His saints. This is a necessary first step.

The internal, spiritual reign of Christ as Savior and Lord must not be overlooked or minimized in importance. One cannot enter into the kingdom of God apart from spiritual rebirth:

Truly, truly I say unto you, except one be born from above, he cannot see the kingdom of God. John 3:3

Those who are redeemed have already been transferred into the kingdom of God's beloved Son (Colossians 1:13) and as such appreciate that "the kingdom of God is... righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Romans 14:17).4

If the new birth stops with growth on the inside, then it is not true saving faith, just like a light that is hidden under a bushel is not a real light (Matthew 5:14–16). Encouraging someone to be "warmed and filled" is not an expression of true faith (James 2:16). True spirituality is the Christian faith manifested. Jesus exhibited His love for the world in deeds of love and righteousness.

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

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### Do You Think He Has Forgotten You?

Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go ahead of Him to the other side. After leaving them, He went up on a mountainside by Himself to pray.

He saw that they were in serious trouble, rowing hard and struggling against the wind and waves. About three o'clock in the morning He came to them, walking on the water. Mark 6:45-46, 48

Jesus did not come immediately; indeed, it was almost morning when He came, and the disciples had been struggling all night in the storm. Yet He had not been indifferent to them meanwhile. From the mountainside where He was praying-He kept His eye upon them. "He saw that they were in serious trouble." All that dark night, He kept a watch upon that little boat that bore His disciples in the midst of the waves.


There is something very suggestive in the narrative. This 'boat in the storm', is a picture of 'Christ's friends in this world, in the storms of life'. Sometimes we think we are forgotten--but from His place in glory, Christ's eye is always on us! He sees us struggling, battling with the waves, beaten, and distressed. He has full sympathy with us in all our struggles. It ought to be a great strength and comfort to us in trial, to know this. Jesus intercedes for us in our distresses!

It may not be best always to deliver us immediately--but His prayer continually ascends, that our faith may not fail in the struggle. This also should encourage us.

Then, He always comes in time. He may delay long--but it is never too long. If we call upon Him in trouble--we may be sure that He hears and sees us, and knows just how hard it is for us to endure; that He prays for us that we may not fail, and that He will come at the right time for our deliverance!





# Had a Slip? Is Your Recovery Failing?



"I will love them freely." Hosea 14:4

This is a condensed version of the glorious message of salvation which was delivered to us in Christ Jesus our Redeemer. It hinges upon the word "freely." This is the glorious, the suitable, the divine way by which love streams from heaven to earth, a spontaneous love flowing to those who neither deserved it, purchased it, nor sought it. It is, indeed, the only way in which God can love us as we are.

The text is a death-blow to all sorts of conditions: "I will love them freely." Now, if there were any fitness necessary in us, then he would not love us freely, at least, this would be a mitigation and a drawback to the freeness of it. But it stands, "I will love you freely."

We complain, "Lord, my heart is so hard."

"I will love you freely."

"But I do not feel my need of Christ as I would like."

""I will not love you because you feel your need; I will love you freely."



### "But I do not feel that softening of spirit which I desire."

Remember, the softening of spirit is not a condition, for there are no conditions; the covenant of grace has no conditionality whatever; so that we without any fitness may venture upon the promise of God which was made to us in Christ Jesus, when he said, "He that believeth on him is not condemned."

It is a blessing to know that the grace of God is free to us at all times, without preparation, without fitness, without money, and without price! "I will love them freely."

These words invite backsliders to return: indeed, the text was specially written for them -- "I will heal their backsliding; I will love them freely."

If you are a backslider, surely the generosity of the promise will at once break your heart, and you will return, and seek your injured Father's face.

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
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# Humor In Recovery
